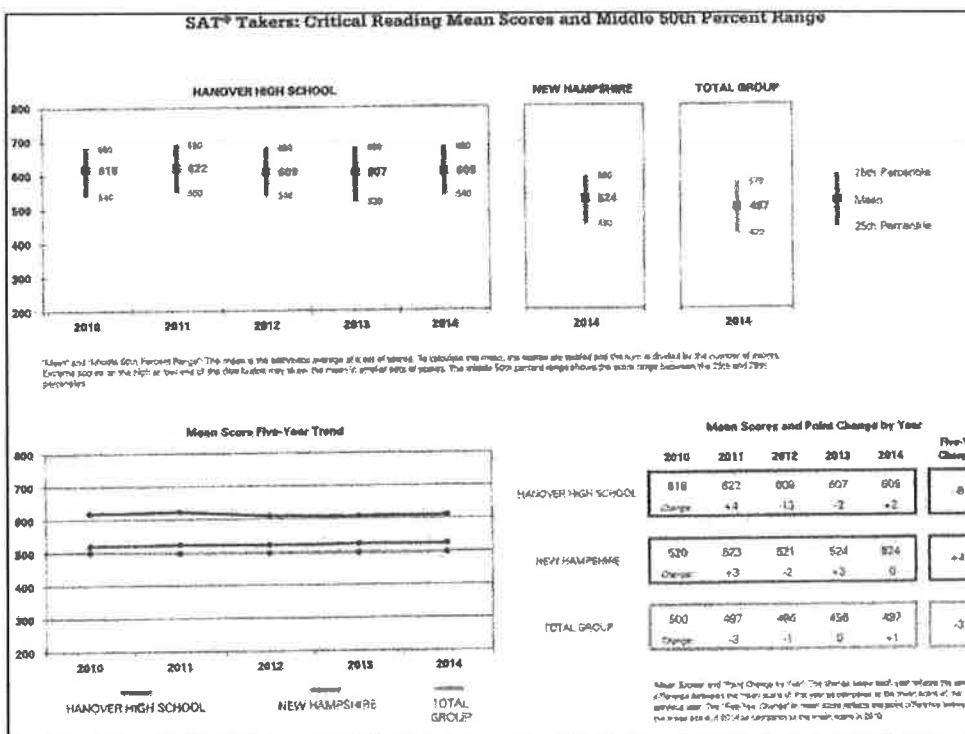

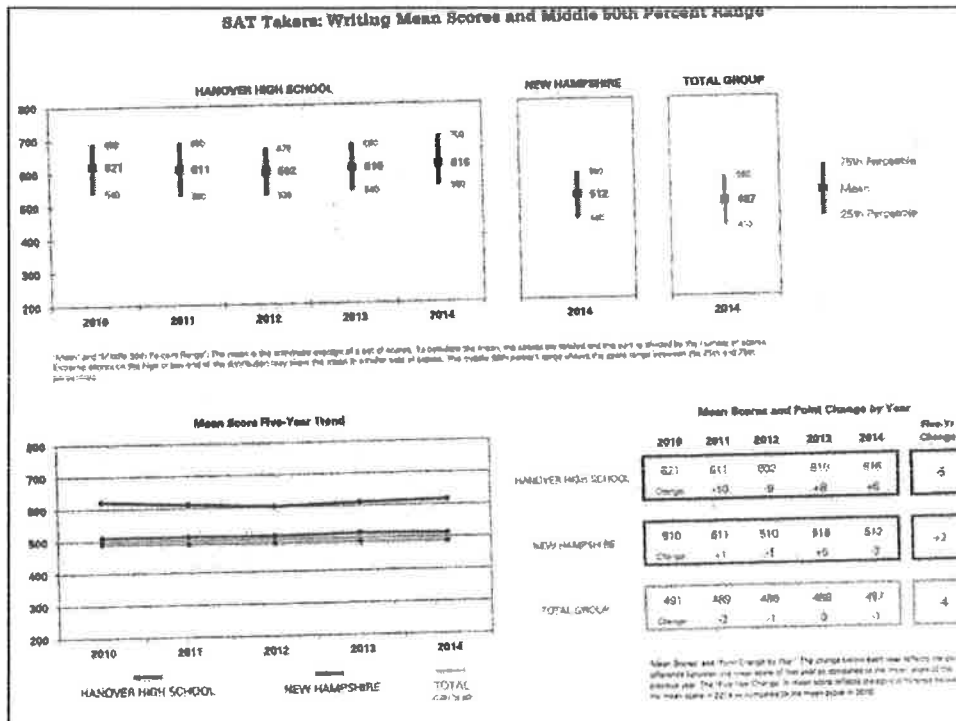
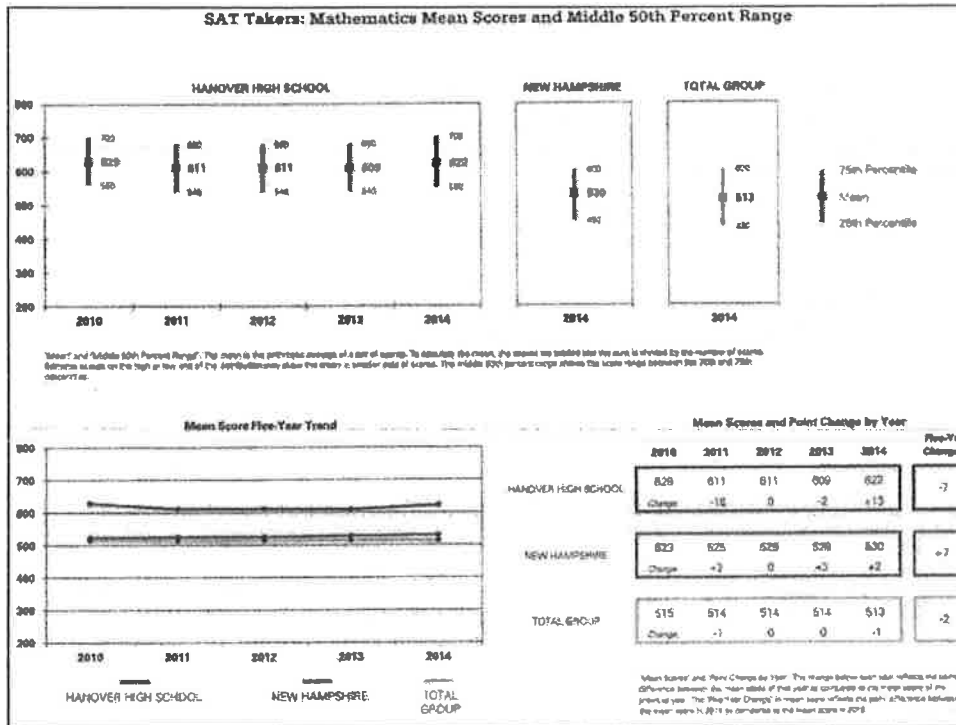

- ⇒ 158 of our students attending 4 year Colleges
- ⇒ 82% of the 4 years schools are in the 2015 Princeton Review Book of 379 Best Colleges
- ⇒ 86% of our students attending 4 year colleges are going to these colleges
- ⇒ 11% (17) of these graduates are attending one of the Ivy League Schools (7 of 8)
